What is TRB?

The TRB is the Teen Review Board, a volunteer opportunity for teens who love to read, watch movies, play video games, listen to music by a wide range of artists, and like to share their opinion.

TRB members review books, audiobooks, movies, games and music borrowed from the library, and those reviews are posted on the library's website.

High school students receive one volunteer hour credit for each submitted review that meets our guidelines. Basically, you earn volunteer hours by doing what you already love – you just have to tell us about it!

TRB reviewing is done on your own time. There are no meetings, and no scheduled hours. If you have internet access, you can submit reviews online any time. If not, you can drop them off at your neighbourhood branch whenever you visit.

Basic TRB Review Guidelines

Full guidelines will be provided to TRB members.

All items reviewed must be in the Kingston Frontenac Public Library's collection.

Single word, one line, and superficial reviews won't be accepted. We're looking for thoughtful reviews that share your opinion.

This might seem obvious, but you must write the review yourself!

Our rating system

One star – Do yourself a favour. Don't bother!

Two stars – Easy to put down.

Three stars – Worth your time.

Four stars – In this year's top ten.

Five stars – Stayed up all night!
