KFPL invites women to learn financial literacy from local experts

Giving women insight into financial literacy helps ensure a secure financial future for women and for their families. Building financial skills and knowledge is critical not just in the daily management of money, but in closing wage and wealth gaps too. Kingston Frontenac Public Library is offering women a chance to improve their financial know-how with a series of KFPL Live talks, starting July 13.

[Financial Literacy for Women](#) takes place Tuesday, July 13 from 7 to 8:30 p.m. with local financial advisor Laura Southall and Melissa Baker-Cox sharing their expertise in a virtual format. The duo is returning to the library after providing a popular talk in April, based on their 2020 book *Rental Properties for Canadian Women*.

“If you feel overwhelmed by all things financial -- from affording your children’s post-secondary education to saving for your retirement -- this talk and its three successors will cover the basics of financial literacy through to retirement and beyond,” said Anne Hall, Programming and Outreach Librarian at KFPL.

This is the first of four upcoming presentations on financial literacy for women. Watch for the next installment on Tuesday, October 5: Getting Ready to Retire. It will be followed on Tuesday, November 2 by Saving Taxes in Retirement, and on Tuesday, November 30 by Passing On Your Wealth.
