Three free KFPL presentations to help you make a will

Without a will in place, wishes for the distribution of property, care of any minor dependents, and other plans for what ultimately happens with one's estate are left to chance. Kingston Frontenac Public Library is offering three presentations for Make-a-Will Month to help residents ensure they have this legal documentation in place.

"November is Make a Will Month," explained Anne Hall, Programming and Outreach Librarian. "Have you been putting off writing your will? Are you considering drawing up a power of attorney — for yourself or for a parent? Does the thought of estate planning make you anxious? Then plan to attend one of our three free online KFPL Live talks, offered annually with the help of the Ontario Bar Association."

Ontario estate lawyers will explain why advance planning is so advisable, and what common pitfalls to avoid when preparing a will. They will discuss power of attorney issues, and the roles and responsibilities of executors and attorneys for property and personal care. Attendees will be able to ask questions, but no legal advice will be provided.
