Dig deep into genealogy with a one-on-one research help session

Many people picked up genealogical research as a pandemic activity, and many are getting started tracing their roots. Kingston Frontenac Public Library's new Genealogy One-on-One Sessions will be an invaluable resource for everyone researching the past.

On Tuesday afternoons from November 9 through December 7, Local History and Genealogy Librarian Joanne Stanbridge will meet with registered patrons for half-hour individual sessions. Patrons have the option of meeting in person, over the telephone, or on Zoom to discuss their research. In-person sessions will take place on the second floor of the Central Branch.

"Whether you're creating a family tree for the first time or tracking down a 'brick-wall' ancestor, Kingston Frontenac Public Library is here to help," Stanbridge said.

She noted patrons should prepare a question in advance as 30 minutes will fly past.

Every Tuesday at 9 a.m., registration will open for the following week. For example, if a patron wants to register for the November 23 session, registration will open on November 16.
