Learn to navigate the news around climate change with KFPL and Sustainable Kingston

Floods, forest fires, drought and heatwaves: climate events are happening frequently, with many conflicting opinions and perspectives in media. How can we tell what is factual and what is false?

Join Geoff Hendry from <u>Sustainable Kingston</u> for a helpful introduction to navigating the news around climate change. Sustainable Kingston's mission is to enhance the livability and resiliency of Kingston, sharing knowledge and providing programs that drive community action.

During Navigating the News: Climate Change, learn who is conducting climate change research and how reliable their findings are. Explore how trustworthy reporting and interpretation of that climate research is, when filtered through news outlets, pundits and governments. Having these conversations with friends and family can be especially polarizing so this seminar will also touch on how to talk to others with different views.
