


Juvenis Festival

Parham Branch Grand Re-Opening



Community Engagement

The KFPL Board formed their Community
Engagement Committee in response to
public concerns about changes to the
library's Code of Conduct. Representatives
from the community and the Board met
throughout the latter half of the year to develop
a process to engage the community in decisionmaking. The new process will be used to
review the library's Code of Conduct in 2017.



Facilities

Pittsburgh Branch

Two capital repair projects were completed: the roof replacement and the replacement of the rooftop HVAC unit. While the work was done in 2016, the final site clean-up will be completed in the spring of 2017.



Central Branch

The Central Branch renovation project moved forward, with the prequalification of general contractors in the fall in preparation for the release of the tender in early 2017. The branch closed in late November and the library's collection, staff and services were moved to temporary locations.

Mountain Grove Branch

KFPL continued to work with the Township of Central Frontenac on the design and construction of a new library in Mountain Grove to replace the older facility.

Rideau Heights Community Centre Branch

In partnership with the City of Kingston, KFPL reviewed construction and layout plans for the new Rideau Heights Community Centre Project. Construction on the year-long project started in late November.


