Celebrate and honour the achievements of local women as International Women's Day (Mar. 8) approaches. On Mar. 4, the Central Branch of the Kingston Frontenac Public Library (KFPL) will host "International Women's Week Opening Event: Celebrating Kingston Women," an all-ages event highlighting art, performances and stories of strength and perseverance.

Performers include newcomer singer Inna Leshchuk, Kingston Poet Laureate Sadiqa de Meijer and Indigenous hand drummers.

"This evening is a testament to the resilience and courage of our community," the International Women's Week organizing committee shared in a joint statement. "This is an opportunity to uplift voices, especially those of equity-deserving women and survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence. We can foster empowerment for generations by coming together as a community."

The event, developed in collaboration with Kingston Interval House, SAC Kingston, Resolve Counselling, Trellis, Kingston Immigration Partnership, Kingston Anti-Violence Advisory Council, Kingston Frontenac Anti-Violence Coordinating Committee and KFPL, will be welcoming and inclusive for all attendees.

From interactive creativity sessions and captivating performances to a social gathering, the evening is designed to engage and inspire people of all ages. Kids' activities include button-making and hands-on demonstrations of KFPL's robots.
