### **LEGO My Library**

Learn the basics of stop-motion animation in this free hands-on workshop presented in collaboration with Reelout Queer Film Festival and Queen’s University. Seattle-based filmmaker Clyde Petersen (director of the feature-length film *Torrey Pines*) will share some of his techniques and processes. Participants will build characters and backgrounds out of cut-out paper and animate a short scene using the iStopmotion app. All materials will be provided. Adults and children 6 and up are welcome. Children under 10 should be accompanied by an adult.

For Free Ticket events, tickets will be available at the branch half an hour before show time. Limit of 6 tickets per person.

For Drop-in events, admission is first come, first served.

The Library is unable to accommodate groups at registered or drop-in programs for children. Groups include classes, daycares, daycamps, community groups, and any groups providing childcare and/or educational/recreational services to children.
